Collections within our Collections: George B. Adams patent of 1896

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Several years ago, I was in England on a train with Fletcher Wallis on our way to the Newark Antiques Faire, and we were talking corkscrews, of course. And, at some point we were discussing a particular corkscrew maker, and Wally referred to the person as a "...pathological inventor."

In doing research into George B. Adams, and the myriad of patents that he was awarded, Wally's characterization seems similarly appropriate. Here are a few of his patents—the bolded ones are the patent dates present on the pinback corkscrew. Alma Adams (his spouse) was awarded one patent in 1898 (608,357) for a Badge, with a second patent (630,779) also for a Badge in 1899 with George B. being assigned half of the patent.

As mentioned, there are three of Adams' patent dates that appear on the pinback corkscrew, and none of the patent drawings mention corkscrew, and each of those three patents were assigned to Whitehead & Hoag Company who were beyond prolific in their celluloid, pinback, and medal advertisement business.







In 2007, collector Mark Woodard found an example of the R.V. PIERCE, M. D., Pres. World's Dispensary Medical Ass' n" Adams patent pinback corkscrew on a non-eBay auction. And, in short order he sent information about his find to Don Bull, who featured the corkscrew on his *Weekly Screw*.




Around this time, Jack Bandy weighed on a past trade with Bull, that included a MANGELS & SCHMIDT'S pinback corkscrew, which Bull also shared on his *Weekly Screw* a week later.



It wasn't more than a few weeks later, that I found a similar pinback corkscrew, but with the slogan "I HAVE MY "EYE" ON YOU."







When Bull sold off his collection of "American stuff," Tommy picked up the Mangels and Schmidt's, and at some point, I got a second R.V. Pierce corkscrew, which I offered in trade to Tommy in exchange for the Mangels.

After a while...he agreed.

Earlier this year, there was an auction that also had an Adams patent Whitehead and Hoag corkscrew. This example features advertising:

"COMPLIMENTS OF R. D. BRADNER, DRUGGIST, 85 BLOOMFIELD AVE., NEWARK, N.J."





While there isn't much information out there about these pinback corkscrews, there are some coincidences with a couple of them. Mangels & Schmidt, R.D. Bradner, G.B. Adams, and Whitehead and Hoag were all located in Newark, New Jersey.

The odd man out would be R.V. Pierce whose medical association was located in Buffalo, NY.

Although, in looking at advertisements from the time, R.D. Bradner sold medicines made by R.V. Pierce.

Could there be a connection? Could Bradner have received a Dr. Pierce advertising corkscrew and thought it was a good marketing tool? Could it be that Dr. Pierce paid Bradner a visit in Newark?
